

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






USDA Data 5 September 2023 – main difference, big 2023 adjustment down in production (4.41 MMT lower) = tightening supply







So the 2023 weakness is mainly from Pakistan, and China, India is actually up, but in 2024, India is set at 2 MMT less, while Pak, China, U.S., and Myanmar show clear growth in exporting countries to offer some support for a market looking tight with India's restrictions. The situation could be less volatile than it is now, but

What did I say in Phuket? 2022 highlights; what to look for in 2023

- Grain markets, especially feed market influence:
 - impact with Indian broken rice ban
 - unclear production expectations from Black Sea (2022 weather/heatwave could lend to 2023 tightness
 - China bought 2 MMT from India in 2022, what happens in 2023
- Indian rice exports under current broken rice ban
 - Feed quality rice sales and how effectively will ban be held
 - Indian wheat market as a point pressuring Indian cereal markets
- Inflation, dollar and Global economy in recession
- Asian production and supply under scrutiny
 - Thai rice production looks to offer a strong main crop (especially for Hom Mali)
 - Indian, Chinese and Pak rice productions weaker, Pak impact from floods
 - Myanmar, Vietnam expected steady
- Destination market response inflation, weaker purchasing power, early 2023 shows strong inventory from 2022

Weather:


- El Nino / Monsoon / Flooding / Drought unclear supply

Politics:

- India ban brokens (Sep 22), India ban white non-basmati rice (20 Jul 2023), 20% duty on non-basmati parboiled rice (25 Aug 2023), Minimum Export Price \$1200 PMT for Indian basmati
- Myanmar ban all rice except PB (1 Sep to 15 Oct 2023) maybe just control export licences (Latest!!)
- Indian elections in May 2024
- Food inflation around the world
- Africa political tensions, Niger and now Gabon
- War in Ukraine is still there
- Availability of Indian (can also say Chinese) stocks to world markets

So what happens in India impacts all!

- India is stopping export of it's subsidies, water, fertilizer and this equates to rice exports being reduced
 - Ban of broken rice, non-basmati white rice, MEP (\$1200 PMT) for Basmati and 20% duty on parboiled rice (up to 16 Oct 2023)
- This is to manage inflation, as India focuses on its own consumers
- Of course, elections in May 2024 also provide and undercurrent
- Exports are "managed" with rice diplomacy and creation of National Cooperative Exports Limited (NCEL) which came alongside announcements for exports to Bhutan (79 TMT), Mauritius (14 TMT), and Singapore (50 TMT).
- Will there be more? How much? Where? When?
- Current focus is to calm prices, but as we look ahead, we could also see:
 - FCI procurement gain from weaker prices when kharif crop arrives
 - Gol injections in 2024 to help cool prices
 - 2024 rabi and maybe kharif crops in focus, while export policy shifts in between





Indian Rice Market activities in last 12 months

- 24 Sep 2022 Ban on broken rice
- Dec 2022 reduction of public distribution rice quantity (roughly translates to 2 MMT less availability per month)
- 20 Jul 2023 Ban on white rice exports
- 25 Aug 2023 20% duty on Indian non-basmati parboiled rice (until 15 Oct 2023) maybe longer?
- 25 Aug 2023 Minimum Export Price of \$1200 PMT for Indian basmati rice exports

Up ahead:

- Monsoon in progress, August rains are slow, planting is ahead of 2022, but weakness in rains is a worry
- Indian General Elections (Apr/May 2024) why is this important?
 - Manage domestic food inflation / limiting exports reduced local price in India, but exports inflation to destination markets
 - Food Corporation of India procurement and injection of rice into domestic markets
 - Export policy strategies ahead The days of Covid free-food injections into exports looks to be limited as Indian subsidies are not available in cheap Indian exports
- Politically driven policies and Humanitarian exports Rice Diplomacy





Rest of the world shows rising prices and challenges as speculation added


- Suppliers across the supply chain create waves of defaults, losses and complications:
 - Short sales are punished the only successful seller is one who has the rice in his warehouse
 - Lots of renegotiations, delivery delays and this means shipping and logistics across the chain show rising costs
 - More uncertainty
- Buyer's interest
 - **Bulog** is probably the most active buyer, initially from Thai and Viet exports, but recent talks show activity in Pakistan, Myanmar, Cambodia and India, as buyers look across all supply sources to secure supplies (in Indonesia's case, before elections in early 2024)
 - **Bernas** is similar as wider interest from more origins show
 - Philippines has been active, now Philippines government voices grow
 - China looks muted, but will China come back after floods? For now, unclear as most demand is for glutinous and fragrant rice.
 - Bangladesh was interested, but sees prices as too high. Bangladesh may focus on it's own monsoon crop ahead for now.
 - African and Middle East buyers look well-stocked up to October, but when stocks run out, purchasing decisions will come

PRICES RISE, SUPPLY CONCERNS GROW, INDIA STAYS IN VIEW AS POLITICS AND WEATHER TAKE CENTER STAGE

Bulog purchases and interest meet tough supplier markets. Bulog budgets for imports seen challenged by rising costs of imports, while earlier deals look attractive, but some 600-700 TMT of imports suggested to be still needed by end of 2023.

Is India politicizing rice exports?

Broken rice allowances, recent Mali considerations open the door to Indian rice exports resuming under a controlled environment.

Vietnam discusses stocks, sales and rice balance as speculative elements push many suppliers to renegotiate contracts, while new purchases remain thin.

Pakistan and Myanmar lick lips as improved crop expectations drive hopes. Price is the main question in heated global markets, but with India looking limited, Pakistan and Myanmar's improved crops usher hopes for next export season.

Weather fuels trade. Storms in China, <u>Philippines</u> and East Coast of India (and Bangladesh) add weather sparks.


